Crochet pattern Bear Chef



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Attention!

For working on this pattern, basic crochet skills are required.

When using these materials, the bear turns out to be about 30-31 cm tall.

Note

- Yarn consumption, size and appearance of the toy depend on the crocheting density. Try to crochet your toys as tightly as possible so that there are no gaps between the loops.
- Crochet in a spiral, unless otherwise indicated in the description.
- At the beginning of the round, use a marker or thread of a different color to mark the first stitch of each new round.
- If you have any difficulties with an amigurumi ring, you can crochet a chain ch2 and crochet the required number of sc in the second chain from the hook.
- The bear is crocheted in a mixed way, and the outfit with checkmarks.

Required Materials.

1. Bear:

- Super Bulky/Super Chunky velvet yarn Himalaya Dolphin baby (100% micropolyester, 120m/100g) - color of your choice, I have No.80317 (beige) – 1 skein (if you crochet freely, you need a little more skein);
- Super Bulky/Super Chunky velvet yarn Himalaya Dolphin baby (100% micropolyester, 120m/100g) or analog color No.80308 (milky) for the muzzle;

2. Outfit:

 Sport weight/4ply yarn Alize Cotton Gold (55% cotton, 45% acrylic, 330m/100g) or analogs, color No.55 (white);

Sport weight/4ply yarn Alize Cotton Gold (55% cotton, 45% acrylic, 330m/100g) or analogs, color No.60 (black);

- 3. Hooks size 4 mm, 2.5 mm;
- Polyester toy filling (fiberfill, synthetic filling);
- 5. Safety eyes size 12 mm;
- 6. Safety nose size 13*15 mm;
- 7. Thin black thread for embroidering the mouth and nose;
- 8. Needle for sewing clothes (with a large eye);
- 9. Small black buttons on legs size 7-8 mm 6 pcs.



Abbreviations

MR - magic ring

ch - chain

sl st - slip stitch

sc - single crochet

3 sc inc - crochet 3 sc in one stitch

dec - invisible decrease (2 sc together through front loops)

inc - increase (2 sc in one stitch of the previous round)

dc - double crochet

dcinc -double crochet increase (2 dc in one stitch)

dc2tog - crochet 2 dc together

(...) – the numbers in brackets indicate the number of loops in a particular round

If you have a little experience or crochet very loosely, I recommend taking the hook size 3.5

mm for crocheting a bear.

Arms (2 pieces)

Crochet with velvet beige yarn, hook size 4 mm.

1 Rnd: 6 sc in MR

2 Rnd: inc*6 times (12)

3-5 Rnd: 12 sc (3 rounds)

6 Rnd: 2 dec, 8 sc (10)

7-16 Rnd: 10 sc (10 rounds)

Crochet 1 extra sc. Stuff with fiberfill only the lower part. Fold the arm in half and crochet 5 sc through both sides. Fasten off and cut the yarn.

Legs (2 pieces)

Crochet with velvet beige yarn, hook size 4 mm.
Stuff in the process.

Ch6.



1 Rnd: start in the second chain from the hook: inc, 3 sc, 3 sc in the last chain, 4 sc on the

other side of the chain (12)

2 Rnd: 2 inc, 3 sc, 3 inc, 3 sc, inc (18)

3 Rnd: (1 sc, inc)*2 times, 3 sc, (1 sc, inc)*3 times,

4 sc, inc (24)

4-5 Rnd: 24 sc (2 rounds)

Align the marker to the middle of the back. Crochet extra stitches (I have 3 sc)

6 Rnd: 8 sc, (1 sc, dec)*3 times, 7 sc (21)

7 Rnd: 7 sc, 3 dec, 8 sc (18)

8 Rnd: 6 sc, 3 dec, 6 sc (15)

9-16 Rnd: 15 sc (8 rounds)

Crochet 6 sc on the right leg and cut the yarn.

Do not crochet the last 2 sc on the left leg in Rnd 16.

Attention! Everyone has a different crochet density, so you may need to crochet 1-2 sc more or less on each leg to make them look even.

e right leg with sl st to the place where

Do not cut the yarn on the left leg. Ch3, join with the right leg with sl st to the place where we finished.







Body + Head

17 Rnd: 15 sc on the right leg, 3 sc on the chain, 15 sc on the left leg, 3 sc on the chain (36)

Move the marker hete.

18 Rnd: (5 sc, inc)*6 times (42)

19-27 Rnd: 42 sc (9 rounds)

28 Rnd: (5 sc, dec)*6 times (36)

29-30 Rnd: 36 sc (2 rounds)

31 Rnd: (4 sc, dec)*6 times (30)

32-33 Rnd: 30 sc (2 rounds)

34 Rnd: (3 sc, dec)*6 times (24)

35 Rnd: 24 sc

Align the marker to the middle of the back.

Crochet extra stitches (I have 14 sc)

Join the arms in the next round. Make sure that they are located symmetrically on the sides of the body.

36 Rnd: 3 sc, 5 sc with the first arm, 7 sc, 5 sc with the second arm, 4 sc (24)

37 Rnd: (2 sc, dec)*6 times (18)

38 Rnd: 18 sc













Head

39 Rnd: 1 sc, (1 sc, inc)*3 times, 3 sc, (1 sc,

inc)*3 times, 2 sc (24)

40 Rnd: 1 sc, (inc, 2 sc)*3 times, 3 sc, (inc, 2

sc)*3 times, 2 sc (30)

41 Rnd: 1 sc, (3 sc, inc)*3 times, 3 sc, (3 sc,

inc)*3 times, 2 sc (36)

42 Rnd: (5 sc, inc)*6 times (42)

43 Rnd: 3 sc, inc (6 sc, inc)*5 times, 3 sc (48)

44-47 Rnd: 48 sc (4 rounds)

48 Rnd: (6 sc, dec)*6 times (42)

49-52 Rnd: 42 sc (4 rounds)

Insert safety eyes between Rnd 47 and 48, at a

distance of 7 sc from each other.

Stuff with fiberfill. Stuff the neck tighter.

53 Rnd: (5 sc, dec)*6 times (36)

54 Rnd: 36 sc

55 Rnd: (4 sc, dec)*6 times (30)

56 Rnd: (3 sc, dec)*6 times (24)

57 Rnd: (2 sc, dec)*6 times (18)

Stuff with fiberfill.

58 Rnd: (1 sc, dec)*6 times (12)

59 Rnd: dec*6 times (6)

Tighten the hole, fasten off and weave in the yarn

ends.









Muzzle

Crochet with velvet milky yarn, hook size 4 mm. Ch6.

1 Rnd: start in the second chain from the hook: inc,

3 sc, 3 sc in the last chain, 4 sc on the other side of

the chain (12)

2 Rnd: 2 inc, 3 sc, 3 inc, 3 sc, inc (18)


3 Rnd: (1 sc, inc)*2 times, 3 sc, (1 sc, inc)*3 times,

4 sc, inc (24)

4 Rnd: 24 sc

Fasten off, cut the yarn, leaving a long tail for sewing.

Ears (2 pieces)



1 Rnd: 6 sc in MR

2 Rnd: inc*6 times (12)

3 Rnd: (1 sc, inc)*6 times (18)

4-5 Rnd: 18 sc (2 rounds)

Fasten off, cut the yarn, leaving a long tail for sewing.

Tail

Crochet with velvet beige yarn, hook size 4 mm.

1 Rnd: 6 sc in MR

2 Rnd: inc*6 times (12)

3 Rnd: dec*6 times (6)

Fasten off, cut the yarn, leaving a long tail for sewing.

Assembly and Decoration

Count 2 rounds down from the edge of the muzzle and insert a safety nose.
 Sew the muzzle to the head close to the eyes (see photo). Stuff the muzzle with fiberfill when sewing.










2. Sew the ears to the head in the form of an arch. Sew in a circle from both sides.

The distance between the ears – about 7 sc.



3. Next, make a tightening, watch the video at the link: https://youtu.be/3WaQeExOHbk
Insert the needle at point A and exit through point B, insert at point C and exit through point D. Tighten the threads. Repeat the same with the second eye: insert the needle at point A and exit through point E, insert at point F and exit through point D. Tighten the threads, fix them and hind inside.











5. Sew on the tail.







Your Bear is ready!

Next, crochet a cook's uniform for him.

Chef's tunic.

Crochet with white yarn, hook size 2.5 mm.

Attention! If your bear is more than 36 cm tall, then use a hook size 3 mm to crochet

outfit.

Ch65.

Turn at the end of each row and crochet ch1.

1 Row: from the second chain on the hook: 12 sc, 3 sc inc, 10 sc, 3 sc inc, 16 sc, 3 sc inc, 10 sc, 3 sc inc, 12 sc (72)

Make buttonholes in the next row.

2 Row: 62 sc, ch2, skip 2 sc, crochet from the next stitch 5 sc, ch2, skip 2 sc, 1 sc in the next stitch (72)

3 Row: 13 sc, 3 sc inc, 12 sc, 3 sc inc, 18 sc, 3 sc inc,

12 sc, 3 sc inc, 13 sc (80)

4 Row: 80 sc

5 Row: 14 sc, 3 sc inc, 14 sc, 3 sc inc, 20 sc, 3 sc inc,

14 sc, 3 sc inc, 14 sc (88)

6 Row: 88 sc

7 Row: 15 sc, 3 sc inc, 16 sc, 3 sc inc, 22 sc, 3 sc inc,

16 sc, 3 sc inc, 15 sc (96)

Form sleeves in the next Row.

8 Row: 17 sc, ch5, skip 18 sc, crochet from the next stitch 26 sc, ch5, skip 18 sc, crochet from the next stitch 17 sc (70)









Attention! Remember to try on the outfit from the very beginning so that you can redone them if they are suddenly large or small. Adjust the size of the clothes with a hook size larger or smaller than the size indicated in the description.

9 Row: 10 sc, (inc, 6 sc)*7 times, inc, 10 sc (78)

Make buttonholes in the next row.

10 Row: 68 sc, ch2, skip 2 sc, crochet from the next stitch 5 sc, ch2, skip 2 sc, 1 sc in the next stitch (78)

11 Row: 78 sc

12 Row: 19 sc, inc, 38 sc, inc, 19 sc (80)

13 Row: 80 sc

14 Row: (10 sc, inc)*2 times, 36 sc, (inc, 10 sc)*2 times

(84)

15-17 Row: 84 sc (3 rounds)

Make buttonholes in the next row.

18 Row: 74 sc, 2 ch2, skip 2 sc, crochet from the next stitch 5 sc, ch2, skip 2 sc, 1 sc in the next stitch (84)

19-23 Row: 84 sc (5 rounds)









Try on the chef's tunic. If there is not enough length to the tail, crochet a few more rows, if there are too much rows - dissolve.

Do not cut the yarn and crochet the right placket with sc around, crochet inc into the corners.

Next, crochet the collar: 6 sc, 50 dc, 6 sc, inc into the corner.




Crochet the left placket and the bottom with sc around. Fasten off, cut the yarn and weave in the yarn ends.



Attach the black yarn to the right placket and crochet the tunic around with sl st. Attention! Crochet the collar with sc (see photo).

Crochet freely or take a hook size larger.



Do not crochet the bottom with black yarn.



Fasten off, cut the yarn and weave in the yarn ends.

Sleeves

Attach the white yarn to the underarm.

1-13 Rnd: ch1, 25 sc, sl st, turn (13 rounds)

Next, crochet in a spiral.


14-16 Rnd: ch1, 25 sc, sl st (3 rounds)

Change color to black.

17 Rnd: ch1, 25 sc, sl st.

Fasten off, cut the yarn and weave in the yarn ends.

Tuck the last 3 rounds.









Sew buttons to the chef's tunic.





Toque

Crochet with white yarn, hook size 2.5 mm.

Ch 68+ch1, join in a circle with sl st.

1 Rnd: ch1, 68 sc, sl st (68)

ATTENTION! Try on the bear's head, if it's small, crochet according to the description below or take the hook one size larger.







2 Row: (ch2, 24 dc, turn)*repeat 4 rows. Cut the yarn and weave in the yarn ends.

Return to Row 2, skip 9 stitches, attach the yarn to the next stitch and crochet: (ch2, 24 dc, turn)* 4 rows.

Do not cut the yarn, crochet in rounds.

3 Rnd: ch2, 24 dc, ch7, 25 dc, ch7, sl st (64)





4 Rnd: ch2, 6 dc, (7 dc in one stitch, 7 dc)*7 times, 7 dc in one stitch, sl st (112)

5-9 Rnd: ch2, 111 dc (5 rounds)







10 Rnd: ch2, 5 dc, dc2tog, (6 dc, dc2tog)*13 times, sl st (98)

11 Rnd: ch2, 4 dc, dc2tog, (5 dc, dc2tog)*13 times, sl st (84)

12 Rnd: ch2, 3 dc, dc2tog, (4 dc, dc2tog)*13 times, sl st (70)

13 Rnd: ch2, 2 dc, dc2tog, (3 dc, dc2tog)*13 times, sl st (56)

14 Rnd: ch2, 1 dc, dc2tog, (2 dc, dc2tog)*13 times, sl st (42)

15 Rnd: ch2, dc2tog, (1 dc, dc2tog)*13 times, sl st (28)

16 Rnd: dc2tog*14 times (14)

17 Rnd: dc2tog*7 times (7)

Tighten the hole with a needle. Fasten off, cut the yarn and weave in the yarn ends.

Crochet the holes for ears around with sc.









Toque (one size larger)

Crochet with white yarn, hook size 2.5 mm.

See the photos above.

Ch82+ch1, join in a circle with sl st.

1 Rnd: ch1, 82 sc, sl st (82)

2 Rnd: (ch2, 29 dc, turn)*repeat 4 rows. Cut the yarn, weave in the yarn ends.

Return to Rnd 2, skip 11 stitches and attach the yarn to the next stitch, crochet: (ch2, 29 dc, turn)* 4 rows.

Do not cut the yarn, continue crocheting in rounds.

3 Rnd: ch2, 29 dc, ch10, 30 dc, ch10, sl st (80)

4 Rnd: ch2, 6 dc, (7 dc in one stitch, 7 dc)*8 times, 7 dc in one stitch, sl st (126)

5-9 Rnd: ch2, 125 dc (5 rounds)

10 Rnd: ch2, 6 dc, dc2tog, (7 dc, dc2tog)*13 times, sl st (112)

11 Rnd: ch2, 5 dc, dc2tog, (6 dc, dc2tog)*13 times, sl st (98)

12 Rnd: ch2, 4 dc, dc2tog, (5 dc, dc2tog)*13 times, sl st (84)

13 Rnd: ch2, 3 dc, dc2tog, (4 dc, dc2tog)*13 times, sl st (70)

14 Rnd: ch2, 2 dc, dc2tog, (3 dc, dc2tog)*13 times, sl st (56)

15 Rnd: ch2, 1 dc, dc2tog, (2 dc, dc2tog)*13 times, sl st (42)

16 Rnd: ch2, dc2tog, (1 dc, dc2tog)*13 times, sl st (28)

17 Rnd: dc2tog*14 times (14)

18 Rnd: dc2tog*7 times (7)

Tighten the hole with a needle. Fasten off, cut the yarn and weave in the yarn ends. Crochet the holes for ears around with sc.

Pants

Crochet with white or black yarn, hook size 2.5 mm.

First, crochet the elastic band for the pants, you can watch the video at the link: https://youtu.be/575JEGyNI-U

Crochet the rib freely or take a larger hook size.

Ch8.

1-70 Row: from the second chain on the hook: BLO 7 sl st, turn, ch1.

Crochet the rib equal to the circumference of the tummy (I have 70 rows).

Stretch the elastic band on the bear slightly when trying it on.

Sew up the band in a circle. Do not cut the yarn.





1 Rnd: Ch 2, 71 dc along the rib (crochet 2 dc between the stitches). I have 72 dc, but you can have another number of stitches.

Make a hole for the tail in the next round. 2 Rnd: ch2, ch7, skip 7 stitches and crochet from the next stitch: 64 dc, sl st (72)



If you have more than 72 dc along the elastic band, than in Rnd 3 make steady decreases

until 70-76 dc.

3-5 Rnd: ch2, 71 dc, sl st (3 rounds) Next, crochet the pants. 2 sl st, (ch2, 3 dc, turn) * repeat 3 rows. Fasten off. Leave 32 stitches from each side (it's not bad, if you have another



number of stitches; it's important, so that the stitches are equal for both pant legs) and sew up the front and the back parts.



Pant Legs

Attach the yarn to the inner side of the thigh.

1-6 Rnd: ch2, 37 dc, sl st (6 rounds)

Try the pants on, if your length is not enough, crochet more rounds.

7 Rnd: ch1, 38 sc, sl st (38)



I recommend to crochet the black apron for the white pants!

Apron

Ch101, from the second chain on the hook: 100 sc.

Cut the yarn, weave in the yarn ends.

Count 37 stitches from the beginning and attach the yarn to the next stitch, crochet: (ch2, 25 dc, turn)*9 rows. Cut the yarn, weave in the yarn ends. If you wish. You can crochet the apron around with sc.
