

Crochet Terms

This pattern uses US crochet terms.

- ch chain
- AM magic ring
- sc single crochet
- pa double crochet or double crochet
- pe slip stitch or slip stitch
- inc(pb) increase/increase at low point
- dec(pb) decrease in low point
- rem finish off

Final size

Approx. 37cm. (14.5 in.) tall (using worsted acrylic yarn

Materials

and a 4.0 mm hook.)

- Worsted weight yarn (medium/4) in colors:
 - o Sky blue 400 yards/365 meters
 - o Light orange 100 yards/91 meters
 - o Black 5 yards/4 meters
- 4.0mm hook.
- Two safety eyes (15 mm.)
- Yarn needle, stitch markers and scissors.
- Filling material of your choice

Grades

- Knit in rounds, without joining the rounds (unless specified otherwise). Use a point marker to mark the start of a round.
- You can make a larger toy by using a larger hook and thicker yarn (also adjust the size of the eyes).
- Knit the stitches very close together so that the toy keeps its shape and the filling does not show through the stitches.

Legs and body

With sky blue yarn. Knit in rounds, without joining the rounds. Use a point marker to mark the start of a round. Firmly fills legs and body.

Note: The number inside the last parenthesis of each round shows the final point count for that round.

Leg 1:

Round 1: In AM do: [2 sc, 2 dc] x2 (8)

R2: 1 inc (sc) in each stitch (16)

R3: $[7 \text{ inc(sc)}, 1 \text{ sc}] \times 2 (30)$

R4-7: 1 sc in each stitch around (30)

R8: 8 sc, 5 sc (sc), 10 sc, 1 sc (sc) (24) **R9**: 5 sc, 6 sc (sc), 7 sc (18)

R10: 4 sc, 1 sc (sc), 5 sc, 1 sc (sc), 5 sc (16) **R11-12:** 1 sc in each stitch around (16)

R13: 4 sc, 1 inc(sc), 3 sc, 1 inc(sc), 3 sc, 1 inc(sc), 3 sc (19)

R14: 1 sc in each stitch around (19)

R15: 1 inc(sc), 4 sc, 1 inc(sc), 4 sc, 1 inc(sc), 4 sc, 1 inc(sc), 3 sc (23)

R16: 1 sc in each stitch around (23) Cut thread and cast off. {*Photos 1-5*}

Leg 2:

Make leg 2 exactly like leg 1, but do not cut the thread or bind off. {Photo 6}

Join the legs with a piece of yarn and tie a knot (the red yarn is for demonstration purposes only, continue using sky blue). {Photo 7}

Note: It is not relevant at which specific point the legs join, as long as both feet are facing forward and the point count at the end of the round is correct. In round 17 we are going to join the legs, making a single crochet in each point of both legs together.

Continue where you were in leg 2 and with sky blue.

Round 17: 1 single crochet in each stitch of the two legs together (total points in this round: 46, since the last round of each leg has 23 stitches). {*Photos 8-10*} **R18:** [22 sc, 1 inc(sc)] x2 (48) **R19:** [7 sc, 1 inc(sc)] x6 (54)

R20: [8 sc, 1 inc(sc)] x6 (60)

R21-36: 1 sc in each stitch around (60) **R37:** [8 sc, 1 dec(sc)] x6 (54)

R38: 1 sc in each stitch around (54) **R39:** [7 sc, 1 dec(sc)] x6 (48)

R40: 1 sc in each stitch around (48) **R41:** [6 sc, 1 dec(sc)] x6 (42)

R42: 1 sc in each stitch around (42) **R43:** [5 sc, 1 dec(sc)] x6 (36)

R44: 1 sc in each stitch around (36) **R45:** [4 sc, 1 dec(sc)] x6 (30)

R46: 1 sc in each stitch around (30) **R47:** [3 sc, 1 dec(sc)] x6 (24)

R48-49: 1 sc in each stitch around (24) Cut thread and cast off. Leave a long tail to sew to the head. {*Photos 11-17*}

Head

With sky blue. Knit in rounds, without joining the rounds. Place the safety eyes between the 18th and 19th rounds of the head, leaving 11 points between the eyes. Firmly stuff the head.

(Do 1)

Round 1: In AM do: 6 sc (6)

R2: 1 inc (sc) in each stitch (12)

R3: $[1 \text{ sc}, 1 \text{ inc(sc)}] \times 6 (18)$

R4: [2 sc, 1 inc(sc)] x6 (24)

R5: $[3 \text{ sc}, 1 \text{ inc(sc)}] \times 6 (30)$

R6: $[4 \text{ sc}, 1 \text{ inc(sc)}] \times 6 (36)$

R7: $[5 \text{ sc}, 1 \text{ inc(sc)}] \times 6 (42)$

R8: $[6 \text{ sc}, 1 \text{ inc(sc)}] \times 6 (48)$

R9: $[7 \text{ sc}, 1 \text{ inc(sc)}] \times 6 (54)$

R10: $[8 \text{ sc}, 1 \text{ inc(sc)}] \times 6 (60)$

R11-25: 1 sc in each stitch around (60)

R26: $[8 \text{ sc}, 1 \text{ dec(sc)}] \times 6 (54)$

R27: $[7 \text{ sc}, 1 \text{ dec(sc)}] \times 6 (48)$

R28: $[6 \text{ sc}, 1 \text{ dec(sc)}] \times 6 (42)$

R29: $[5 \text{ sc}, 1 \text{ dec(sc)}] \times 6 (36)$

R30: $[4 \text{ sc}, 1 \text{ dec(sc)}] \times 6 (30)$

R31: $[3 \text{ sc}, 1 \text{ dec(sc)}] \times 6 (24)$

Cut thread and finish. {Photos 18-19}

Sew the body to the head. {Photos 20-23}

Nose

With sky blue. Knit in rounds, without joining the rounds. Fill firmly.

(Do 1)

Round 1: In AM do: 6 sc (6)

R2: 1 inc (sc) in each stitch (12)

R3: $[1 \text{ sc}, 1 \text{ inc(sc)}] \times 6 (18)$

R4: [2 sc, 1 inc(sc)] x6 (24)

R5: $[3 \text{ sc}, 1 \text{ inc(sc)}] \times 6 (30)$

R6: $[4 \text{ sc}, 1 \text{ inc(sc)}] \times 6 (36)$

R7: $[5 \text{ sc}, 1 \text{ inc(sc)}] \times 6 (42)$

R8-9: 1 sc in each stitch around (42)

R10: $[5 \text{ sc}, 1 \text{ dec(sc)}] \times 6 (36)$

R11: 1 sc in each stitch around (36) Cut thread and cast

off. Leave a long tail to sew to the head.

{Photos 24-27}

Arms

With sky blue. Knit in rounds, without joining the rounds. Fill your hands firmly and fill the rest of your arm lightly. Flatten the arm opening and sew it on. Then sew the arms to the body.

(Make 2)

Round 1: In AM do: 5 sc (5)

R2: 1 inc (sc) in each stitch (10) R3: 1 inc (sc) in each stitch (20)

R4-11: 1 sc in each stitch around (20)

R12: $[8 \text{ sc}, 1 \text{ dec(sc)}] \times 2 (18)$

R13: 1 sc in each stitch around (18)

R14: $[7 \text{ sc}, 1 \text{ dec(sc)}] \times 2 (16)$

R15: 1 sc in each stitch around (16)

R16: $[6 \text{ sc}, 1 \text{ dec(sc)}] \times 2 (14)$

R17: 1 sc in each stitch around (14)

R18: $[5 \text{ sc}, 1 \text{ dec(sc)}] \times 2 (12)$

R19-25: 1 sc in each stitch around (12) Cut the thread and cast off. Leave a long strand. Sew the arms between rounds 47 and 48 of the body.

{Photos 28-32}

Line

With sky blue. Knit in rounds, without joining the rounds. Fill firmly.

(Do 1)

Round 1: In AM do: 6 sc (6)

R2: 1 sc in each stitch around (6)

R3: 1 inc (sc) in each stitch (12)

R4: 1 sc in each stitch around (12)

R5: $[1 \text{ sc}, 1 \text{ inc(sc)}] \times 6 (18)$

R6-8: 1 sc in each stitch around (18)

R9: $[2 \text{ sc}, 1 \text{ inc(sc)}] \times 6 (24)$

R10-11: 1 sc in each stitch around (24)

R12: [3 sc, 1 inc(sc)] x6 (30)

R13-14: 1 sc in each stitch around (30)

R15: [1 sc, 1 inc(sc)] x6, 18 sc (36)

R16-17: 1 sc in each stitch around (36)

R18: $[2 \text{ sc}, 1 \text{ inc(sc)}] \times 6, 18 \text{ sc} (42)$

R19-21: 1 sc in each stitch around (42)

Cut the thread and finish off. Leave a long tail to sew to the body.

{Photos 33-37}

Spikes

With light orange. Knit in rounds, without joining the rounds. Do not fill.

(Make 7)

Round 1: In AM do: 6 sc (6)

R2: $[1 \text{ sc}, 1 \text{ inc(sc)}] \times 3 (9)$

R3: $[2 \text{ sc}, 1 \text{ inc(sc)}] \times 3 (12)$

R4: $[3 \text{ sc}, 1 \text{ inc(sc)}] \times 3 (15)$

R5: 1 sc in each stitch around (15)

R6: $[4 \text{ sc}, 1 \text{ inc(sc)}] \times 3 (18)$

Cut the thread and finish off. Leave a long tail to sew to the body. {Photos 38-43}

Belly

With light orange. Knit in rows.

(Do 1)

Chain 9.

R1: 1 sc in the second chain from the hook and in the next 7 stitches. Make a chain, turn.

Total point in this round: 8

R2-4: 1 sc in each stitch. Make a chain, turn.

Total point in these rounds: 8

R5: 1 inc(sc), 2 sc, 1 dec(sc), 2 sc, 1 inc(sc). Make a chain, turn.

Total points in this round: 9

R6: 1 sc in each point. Make a chain, turn.

Total points in this round: 9

R7: 4 sc, 1 inc(sc), 4 sc. Make a chain, turn.

Total points in this round: 10

R8: 1 sc in each point. Make a chain, turn.

Total points in this round: 10

R9: 1 inc(sc), 3 sc, 1 dec(sc), 3 sc, 1 inc(sc). Make a chain, turn.

Total points in this round: 11

R10: 1 sc in each point. Make a chain, turn.

Total points in this round: 11

R11: 5 sc, 1 inc(sc), 5 sc. Make a chain, turn.

Total points in this round: 12

R12: 1 sc in each stitch. Make a chain, turn.

Total points in this round: 12

000000 -----

R13: 1 inc(sc), 4 sc, 1 dec(sc), 4 sc, 1 inc(sc). Make a chain, turn.

Total points in this round: 13

R14: 1 sc in each stitch. Make a chain, turn.

Total points in this round: 13

R15: 6 sc, 1 inc(sc), 6 sc. Make a chain, turn.

Total points in this round: 14

R16: 1 sc in each stitch. Make a chain, turn.

Total points in this round: 14

R17: 6 sc, 1 dec(sc), 6 sc. Make a chain, turn.

Total points in this round: 13

R18: 1 dec(sc), 4 sc, 1 inc(sc), 4 sc, 1 dec(sc). Make a chain, turn.

Total points in this round: 12

R19: 5 sc, 1 dec(sc), 5 sc. Make a chain, turn.

Total points in this round: 11

R20: $1 \operatorname{dec}(sc)$, $3 \operatorname{sc}$, $1 \operatorname{inc}(sc)$, $3 \operatorname{sc}$, $1 \operatorname{dec}(sc)$.

Total points in this round: 10

{Photo 44}

Make a round of sc around the sides and top of the belly. Cut the thread and finish off. Leave a long tail to sew to

the body.

{Photos 45-50}


Nostrils

Embroider the nostrils with black yarn. {Photo 51}




